[to keep away from others] seclude; withdraw</p> <p><b>Analogy:</b> <i>sequester : seclusion :: endanger : jeopardy</i></p>	<p>1. include</p>
<b>serrated</b>	<p>adj. [having notched edges like the teeth of a saw] <b>jagged</b>; saw-toothed</p>	
<b>shard</b> ®	<p>n. [a broken piece, esp. of pottery] fragment</p> <p><b>Analogy:</b>  <i>shard : pottery : morsel : food</i>  <i>shard : pottery :: fragment : bone</i></p>	
<b>shaving</b>	<p>n. [a thin slice that has been shaved from something, esp. of wood or metal] <b>sliver</b>; paring</p>	
<b>sheaf</b>	<p>n. [a collection of several things tied together for carrying or storing, as of papers] bundle; package; collection</p>	
<b>shirk</b>	<p>v. [to avoid or neglect one's assigned duties] evade; elude; malingering. Also n.</p> <p><b>Analogy:</b>  <i>duty : shirk :: question : parry</i>  <i>shirk : malingering :: hoard : miser</i></p>	
<b>shoddy</b>	<p>1. adj. [fake] counterfeit; <b>sham</b>; phony</p> <p>2. adj. [made of any cheap, inferior material] <b>tawdry</b>; flimsy; <b>sleazy</b></p>	<p>1.</p> <p>2. superior</p>
<b>sibylline</b>	<p>adj. [<b>phophetic</b>; predicting the future] <b>oracular</b></p>	
<b>sidereal</b>	<p>adj. [of or relating to the stars] <b>astral</b>; <b>stellar</b></p> <p><b>Analogy:</b>  <i>sidereal : stars :: arboreal : trees</i>  <i>star : sidereal :: emotion : affective</i></p>

[one who habitually doubts generally accepted beliefs] doubter</p> <p><b>Related Words:</b>  <i>cynic: n. one who doubts the motives of others</i>  <i>atheist: n. one who doubts and denies the existence of God</i>  <i>heathen, pagan: n. a person who doubts your God and doesn't follow your religion (anyone who is not a Jew, Christian or Muslim is regarded so by some people of these religions)</i>  <i>infidel: n. a person who does not believe in a your God, e.g. among Muslims, a non – Muslim</i></p> <p><b>Analogy:</b> <i>skeptic : credulous :: penitent : obdurate</i></p>	<p>votary</p>
